

When you need assurance of God's love, say this:

God loves me so much that He gave His one and only Son; by believing in Him I can have a whole and lasting life. (John 3:16)

God loves me with an everlasting love. With an unfailing love, He has drawn me to himself. He is merciful, gracious and slow to anger. (Jeremiah 31:3; Exodus 34:6)

God is present within me. He rejoices over me with gladness and sings a happy song over me. Because of His love, He makes no mention of my past sins or even recalls them. (Zeph. 3:17)

I am convinced that nothing can ever separate me from His love. Death can't and life can't. The angels can't and the demons can't. My fears for today, my worries about tomorrow, and even the powers of hell can't keep God's love away. Whether I am high above the sky or in the deepest ocean, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate me from the love of God that is revealed in Jesus Christ my Lord. (Romans 8:38-39)

When you need Godly wisdom, say this:

I am a person of wisdom and prudence. I let the Word of Christ live deep within my heart and it makes me wise. (Col 3:16; Eph. 1:8)

When I need to know what God wants me to do, I ask Him for wisdom. He gladly tells me and does not resent me asking. (James 1:5)

God gives me wisdom, knowledge and happiness because He is pleased with me. (Eccl. 2:26)

I will listen for God's voice in everything I do and everywhere I go; He is the one who will keep me on track. He will guide me along the best pathway for my life. He will advise me and watch over me. (Psalm 32:8; Proverbs 3:6)

The life-giving Spirit of God hovers over me – the Spirit that brings wisdom and understanding, the Spirit that

gives direction and builds strength, the Spirit that instills knowledge and the fear of God. (Isaiah 11:2)

I will trust in the Lord from the bottom of my heart; I will not try to figure out everything on my own. (Proverbs 3:5)

Dare to declare who you are in Christ:

*In Christ...*I am a new person. The old life [my former moral and spiritual condition] is gone, and a new life has begun. (2 Corinthians 5:17)

*In Christ...*I am complete and have become wholly filled and flooded with God Himself. (Eph. 3:19)

*In Christ...*I am part of His body and the devil has no power over me. (1 Corinthians 12:14-27; Luke 9:1; Luke 10:9)

*In Christ...*I can be sure that God will take care of everything I need. (Phil. 4:19)

*In Christ...*I can do anything, because He gives me strength. (Phil. 4:13)

*In Christ...*I am blessed with every kind of spiritual blessing from heaven. (Eph. 1:3)

*In Christ...*I am free from condemnation and have been declared "not guilty" because of Jesus. (Romans 8:1)

*In Christ...*I am more than a conqueror through Him that loves me. (Romans 8:37)

God gave us His Word as a manual for living. He knew that each of us would face challenges and that we would need strength to overcome them. He knew we would need direction in times of uncertainty, peace in days of turmoil, and provision in seasons of lack. He covered all of that in His manual, the Bible.

Read the following paraphrased verses; they're just a few of the many wonderful promises and insights you can find in God's Word.

Think about them.

Look them up in your own Bible.

Speak them out loud to yourself.

Share them with others.

Start your day with them.

Read them just before bed every night.

You'll start realizing just how good God is as you see His Word bringing peace to your mind, strength to your spirit, healing to your body, and abundance to your life.

When you have sinned, say this:

I believe that Jesus died for my sins, that He was buried, and that God raised Him from the dead. I confess Jesus as the Lord of my life. (1Corinthians15:1-4; Romans 10:9-10)

If I confess my sins, He is faithful to forgive my sins and to cleanse me from everything that does not conform to His will, purpose, thought, and plan for my life. (1John 1:9)

I have peace with God through my Lord Jesus Christ. I have been made right with God through Him. God is not angry with me nor is He holding my sin against me. (Romans 5:1; 2 Corinthians 5:19)

I have been set free from sin. Sin no longer dominates me; it is no longer my master. I choose to live for Jesus. (Romans 6:14, 18)

I present my body to God; I belong to Him. The Holy Spirit Himself makes His home within me, and I live to bring glory to Him. (Romans 6:16; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

When you need physical healing, say this:

For you are the Lord my Healer, my Life-Giver. (Exodus 15:26)

The Lord sends a blessing on our bread and our water and takes sickness away from among us. (Exodus 23:25)

He sent His Word and healed me, preserved my life, and delivered me from destruction. (Psalm 107:20)

Jesus bore my sickness and carried my pain. Through His bruises, healing was granted to me. The blows that fell to Him brought me healing. With the stripes that wounded Him, I am healed and made whole. (Isaiah 53:4-5)

By His wounds, I have been healed! (1Peter 2:24)

When you need peace or comfort, say this:

I let the peace of God rule and reign in my heart. I trust God's Peace to act as umpire and call the shots in my life. (Colossians 3:15)

I don't have to feel bad, down or depressed because the joy of the Lord gives me strength. (Nehemiah 8:10)

I don't worry about anything, but I pray about everything and thank God that He hears me. I freely give all of my concerns to the Lord because I know He cares about me. A sense of God's peace and wholeness, everything coming together for my good, comes and settles me down. That peace, which towers above all reasoning, stands guard over my mind, my thoughts and my feelings, in Christ Jesus. (1 Peter 5:7; Phil. 4:6,7)

Jesus gave me His peace; therefore I will not let my heart be troubled or afraid. I will trust in Him. (John 14:27)

God has called me and he is completely dependable. If He said it, He will do it! God Himself has promised me: "I will not in any degree leave you helpless, nor forsake you, nor let you down!" (1Thess. 5:24; Hebrews 13:5)

The Greater One who lives in me is far stronger than anything in the world. He puts me over in life. (1 John 4:4)

Evil can not get close to me; harm can not get through the door. (Psalm 91:10)

I humble myself before God. I tell the devil "NO", and he must get away from me. (James 4:7)

God has not given me a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love and self-discipline. (2 Timothy 1:7)

The Lord is my light and my salvation. So, with Him on my side I'm fearless, afraid of no one and nothing. (Psalm 27:1)

When you have financial needs, say this:

The Lord is my Shepherd; I do not lack a thing! The same God who takes care of my will supply all I need from His glorious riches, which have been given to me in Christ Jesus. (Psalm 23:1; Phil. 4:19)

Since God gave His only Son for me, surely He will freely give me all things. (Romans 8:32)

God gives me power and ability to produce wealth. (Deut. 8:18)

When I give (to others or my church in tithes and offerings), I can expect God to multiply it and bring it back to me. God opens up the windows of heaven and pours in so many blessings that I do not have room to receive it all! (Luke 6:38; Malachi 3:10)

Through Jesus Christ, I am heir to Abraham, and the same promises of blessings that God gave to him belong to me. God blesses me and enables me to be a blessing to others. (Genesis 12:2; Galatians 3:29)

God causes whatever I do to prosper [flourish, thrive, grow, do better, succeed]. God takes pleasure in prospering me! (Psalm 1:1-3, Psalm 35:27)

God put wealth and riches in my house! (Psalm 112:3)

I trust in the Lord and never lack any good thing. (Psalm 34:10)

As I live for God and make His kingdom my primary concern, He gives me all I need from day to day. (Matthew 6:33)

The wealth of the sinner finds its way into my hands, for it has been laid aside for me. (Proverbs 13:22)

When you need to be patient, say this:

Staying with it until the end - that is what God requires. If I stay with it until the end, I won't be sorry; I'll be saved! (Matt. 24:13)

I have patience and cheerful endurance so I can stay with God's plan and then receive all that God has promised. (Hebrews 10:36)

Whenever trouble comes my way, I'll let it be an opportunity for joy. When my faith is tested, my endurance has a chance to grow. So I'll let it grow and become fully developed, then I will be strong in character and ready for anything. (James 1:2-4)
